REARRANGEMENT OF MINTO COAL PRICE

E. Lorne Merrithew Returns
From Ottawa, Where He
Had Satisfactory Interview
With Hon. Mr. Carvell and
Others.

Fredericton, July 19.—E. Lorne Merrithew, who was one of the delegation of the smaller operators of the Grand Lake coal district which went to Ottawa to protest concerning the price of the mine proposed for New Brunswick by Fuel Controller McGrath, returned to Fredericton today. He states that the delegates had a conference with Capt. McGrath, son of the fuel controller, who is an adviser to his father. They also had the opportunity of interviewing Hon. F. B. Carvell. The fuel controller himself was at Washington. Assurances were given the delegation that a rearrangement in the matter of price for Minto coal would be made as the result of representations made by the delegates. He believes that it will be satisfactory to the mine operators. Fuel Controller McGrath was to consider the matter upon his return from Washington.

A SUBMARINE DIRECTED

The Exploits of Capt. Turtle" When He Defeated the Enemy's Ships.

In a file of the Goshen Independent for 1821, of the November 26, is an obituary of Capt. Ezra Lee, a soldier of the Revolution, who had died in Lyme, aged 72, on the 25th ult. It is recognized his daring exploit of a submarine boat in the North Atlantic on enemy ships.

Stating that "it is a little known fact that Capt. Lee is the only man who has ever been under water," the account of his exploit of a submarine boat is as follows: "When the British lay in the River opposite New York, in the Gen. Washington had possession of the city, he was very destructive of such neighbors. A Mr. B. of Saybrook, Conn., who had built a Fulton, constructed a machine, of a conical form, with a person might sit, and which could navigate it depth under water.
