Montreal Longshoremen.
Montreal, April 7.—The syndicated
longshoremen of the port of Mont-
real and the shipping federation have
entered into a new contract by which
wages are increased fifteen cents an
hour over the last contract, and the
rate for the summer of 1919. They
asked for sixty and sixty-five cents
an hour and ten cents an hour extra at
midnight. The contract provided
them sixty cents per hour day work
and sixty-five cents for night work,
commencing at 7 p.m. for general
carries; seventy-five cents an hour
for handling grain and sixty-five cents
an hour day or night for handling
coal. The agreement remains in force
until January 1, 1920 and effects 2,900
men.
The men will get double time for
work on Sundays and during near
holidays.

STATEMENT FROM LLOYD GEORGE TODAY
Promises to Make an Import-
ant Announcement to the

from Paris. The British premier, it
is added, is confined to his Paris
home with a severe chill.
