WAR HERO IN U. S. INFANTRY Pershing Names, for Armistice Day Ceremonies, Man Who Silenced Three Machine Guns and Killed Nineteen of

Pershing has resulted in the designation of Sergeant Samuel Woodfill as the American infantryman who through heroism in the world war, is most entitled to represent the infantry branch of the army at the armistice day ceremonies for America's unknown soldier.

Sergeant Woodfill, whose home is given in army records as Bellevue, and, but who now is stationed at Fort Thomas, Ky., arrived in Washington today in response to orders from the War Department, and on being received by Secretary Weeks was informed that his act of heroism was regarded by his former commander as outstanding among the exploits of all the infantry officers and men who saw service in France.

The act of Sergeant Woodfill, which caused Gen. Pershing to place him—a virtually unknown hero—with Sergeant Alvin C. York of the Tennessee mountains, and Major Charles S. Whittlessy of the Lost Battallon, cocurred on October 12, 1918, during the Meuse-Argonne offensive when he, as a lieutenant, silenced three machine gun fire."
