#### Mrs. Adam Schaefer, Spokane Wash. Has Passed Away

There has been called from this life a well known former resident of Perth County. Mrs. Adam Schaefer, relict of the late Adam Schaefer of Tavistock. Her death occurred in Spokane, Washington, where the family have resided during the last eleven years. The deceased lady had not been in good health for some time, and recently was removed to the hospital where she underwent an operation. Her death however followed on April 20th.

Mrs. Schaefer was seventy one years of age and before her marriage was known as Marie Kalbfleisch. For the greater part of her life had resided in the vicinity of Tavistock. Her husband who was a well known planing mill and furniture manufacturer in Tavistock died in 1899 as the result of an accident in his factory. Surviving her are a number of children all resident in Spokane except Mrs. Louis Loth who resides in Tavistock and Mrs. (Rev) Schaefer of Heidelberg.

The late Mrs. Schaefer had a host of friends and admirers. During her long period of residence in the district of Tavistock she won the respect of many. Many expressions of sorrow will be uttered among them since she has departed from this life.

While residing in Tavistock Mrs. Schaefer was a valuable and a faithful member of Trinity Lutheran Church in Sebastopol. Her assistance and cooperation in women's activities of the congregation were outstanding.

The funeral will be held at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon at Tavistock from the residence of Mrs. Louis Loth to Trinity Lutheran Cemetery. It might be stated that one of the daughters Miss Ada Schaefer visited in this city and other parts recently, and had just returned to Spokane in time to see her mother at the hospital before she passed into the peaceful sleep.

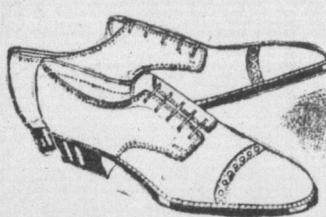
