being so remarkable in its appearance can never be mistaken by the most ignorant of our country herbalists for any injurious substitute.

Note.—The figure regresented in our plate, was supposed to be the Pitcher Plant in *flower*, but unfortunately when it was too late to alter it, we found a specimen in blossom. There are five brilliant crimson petals surrounding the umbrella-like hood. The plate shows the plant after they have dropped off. If our book reaches a second edition, this mistake will be rectified.—A. F. G.
