## An Act to afford relief to the occupants of land in certain cases.

HEREAS the owners or proprietors of land who are non-residents Preamble. of this Province, are, by the existing laws, placed in an unfair advantage over other owners or proprietors of land who have a stated residence within the Province; And whereas it is unfair to individuals, 5 and often detrimental to the public growth and prosperity of whole settlements and communities, that any such preference or advantage should be permitted longer to continue; Therefore Her Majesty, &c. enacts as follows:

I. From and after the first day of January, which will be in the year After 1st Jan., 10 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty, the owner or pro-prietor, or owners or proprietors, of all lands within this Province who no advantage may have no fixed or stated residence within the Province, shall be over residents, placed upon the same footing, and be subject to the same legal responsibilities, as the resident owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, so far by prescriptive

15 as relates to the tenure of the land of which he, or they, n:ay be owner possession. or owners, proprietor or proprietors, and so far as regards any remedy or relief which any occupant in possession may have or ought to have in law, against the owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, of any lands or tenements of which any such occupant may be in possession.

20 II. No occupant in possession of any lands or tenements within this Allactions &e., Province shall be deprived of his right of occupancy or pa 2ssion of to be decided such lands or tenements, or of any right thereto, or any interest therein, of the land in consequence of the owner or proprietor of such lands and tenements were resident being a non-resident of this Province; but all actions, suits, and in the Pro-

25 interests whatever that may arise between the owner or proprietor and the tenant or occupant in possession of any such lands and tenements as aforesaid, shall be adjudicated and decided upon between the parties in all Courts of Law and Equity in this Province, as if such owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, had been stated residents of the
