C A P. LXXVII.

An Act for allowing, until the First Day of *August* One thousand eight hundred and two, the Importation of certain Fish from *Newfoundland* and the Coast of *Labrador*, and for granting a Bounty thereon. [27th June 1801.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to permit the Importation of salted and pickled Salmon and salted dry Cod Fish from the Island of *Newfoundland* and the Coast of *Labrador* into the United Kingdom of *Great Britain* and *Ireland*, and to allow on such Importation a Bounty on every Quintal or Hundred Weight of such Fish so imported; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawful to import from the Island of *Newfoundland*, or the Coast of *Labrador*, into the said United Kingdom, any salted or pickled Salmon, or salted dry Cod Fish, having been taken and cured at the said Places, or either of them, by *British* Subjects, any Law, Custom, or Usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

Preamble.

Salted Salmon or salted dry Cod Fish may be imported from *Newfoundland* or the Coast of *Labrador* by *British* Subjects, and on Importation there shall be allowed a Bounty of 3 s. per Quintal or Cwt.

II. And be it further enacted, That, upon the Importation of such Fish into the said United Kingdom, there shall be paid and allowed to the Importer or Proprietor thereof a Bounty of Three Shillings for every Quintal
