Luke Naylor and Ted Naylor left the Varsity Reds hockey team on Wednesday. Having already lost three productive scorers-Todd Sparks, Derek Cormier and Mike Cavanagh-the loss of the Naylors could prove a devastating blow to UNB hockey, as between the two of them they accounted for approximately 40 points last year.

Luke, who scored 14 goals while working down the right wing last season, opened his 1995-96 account with a goal in Shediac on Monday night. He closed it Wednesday when he confirmed that he and his brother had quit the team. "There were a lot of different rea-

"It was their decision," confirmed Shane Easter, assistant coach for the V-Reds. 




