

MEMORANDUM:

For the Deputy Sup't. General.

I see no objection to carrying out the purchase of wood for the Indians of Fisher's Grant. When I had the question before me at first I thought it was an intended purchase of land which impression may be received from the Timber Inspector's memo of the 10th. of January. I would require, however, proper evidence that the wood standing on the land is for worth the amount that we past for it.

As the amount is really for relief of distress, I propose to charge it to the relief vote, Nova Scotia.
