



MEMORANDUM:

For the Deputy Sup't. General.

I see no objection to carrying out the purchase of wood for the Indians of Fisher's Grant. When I had the question before me at first I thought it was an intended purchase of land which impression may be received from the Timber Inspector's memo of the 10th. of January. I would require, however, proper evidence that the wood standing on the land is worth the amount that we paid for it.

As the amount is really for relief of distress, I propose to charge it to the relief vote, Nova Scotia.
