Ottawa, 28th April, 1909!

Sir,

In reply to your letters of the 6th instant I beg to say that you may fence in, for Enoch's Band, a pasture for the brood-mares which you state will require about 6 miles of wire together with the necessary posts and droppers. The posts may be placed every twelve feet apart with one dropper between so as to make a good strong fence.

You may also purchase the necessary wire and staples for the working men of the Band for fencing fields for farming purposes, provided they supply the necessary posts and labor without cost to the Band and that the total outlay for outfits, scale, food-distributing building, and the wire now referred to, does not exceed the amount stipulated in the terms of surrender.

If you are not aware of the terms of surrender the information will be furnished you. You should be able to inform yourself from the records of your office what sum has been expended so far on outfits etc. The whole expenditure including the Food Distributing Building was not to exceed \$20,000.00 which was to be a charge against
