Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your favour of the 12th instant in reference to the estate of the late Seth W. Hill, enclosing a declaration of S.W. Hill, as to the death of his parents, and also an agreement signed by Mrs. Esther Franklin, a daughter, accepting \$100.00, in full of her share of the estate, which \$100.00 is suggested should be paid out of the funds in the hands of the Department, to the credit of this estate, all of which appear to be satisfactory. It does not appear to the Department whether the boundary lines, as shown on the plan, have been located on the ground, so that each one of those interested will know exactly where the boundary of his or her property is. If it is thought advisable, these lines might be run by a surveyor and monuments placed so that there could be no mistake about them. You might advise the Department as to what you think ought to be done with respect to this boundary question. In the meantime the heirs are hereby authorized to take possession of the lands allotted according to the plan which you submitted to the Department.
