I beg leave to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 18th. ultimo, in which you set forth the necessity for a physician at Natashkwan to render medical attendance to the Indians of that district, and to say in reply that the subject matter of your communication is receiving the consideration of the Department, and as soon as a decision is reached in the matter, I hope to be able to advise you. There are a great many difficulties as you are well aware, in the way of rendering what might be deemed sufficient medical attendance, but the Department is trying to cope with these difficulties from time to time, and hopes in the near future to have the matters in a reasonably satisfactory state.
