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Ottawa, November 2, 1914.

Sir,-

In connection with previous correspondence regarding the children of Mrs. Paul Wesley I have to request that you will advise the Department as to what relation Charles Amessborough is to these children and also as to his character and circumstances and whether the said children are being properly maintained and educated. If they are not receiving proper care and attention a guardian may be appointed by the Superintendent General as provided by Section 27 of the Indian Act and this guardian would have authority to place the children in an industrial school without any consent. Be good enough to give this information at your earliest convenience.
