No suit would lie against the Government of the United States, and no suit could be brought against the Canadian Government (apart from a Petition of Right, with the consent of the Government). The creation of machinery for international disposition of claims of this sort would be cumbersome and expensive. If, however, it is found that the course which is being adopted in respect of army claims does not work out well in practice, it will be open to the Army or to any of the other departments to raise the question again through External Affairs.
