My request to you, Sir, is to ask if it could be in your power to look over my case, which I would be very grateful.

I was sentence to 3 years hard labor, of this sentence I spent 21 months on the 28 of October 1941, in England.

My complaint, Sir, is after my Court-Martial which was the 27 January 1943 in the field, I was told that I would do 24 months of a 3 years sentence, which is one third remission. On my return from England the 4 October this year, I was brought in this prison to serve the rest of my sentence, and was told I would have to serve 28 months 10 days of my 3 years so that it make 4 months 10 days more to do.

Please, Sir, inform me if possible what remission I am to have, the remission I was told at my Court-Martial, or the remission here.

I have done wrote, Sir, and I am paying dearly for it, after 5 years overseas.

I hope, Sir, you will give my case your utmost consideration.
