to protect you in the matter of these additional lands. We have to go to the Provincial Government to ask for them and if we cannot describe them to that Government; they will not be able to record them for your people. So if you want to secure these lands, I would advise you strongly to ask for them now and not leave the matter until it is too late. Do not stand in your own light. If your friend Mr. McCullagh had not thought it wise he would not have helped to prepare the application for them in behalf of the Indians.

In order that you may know further what description Mr. McCullagh gave Mr. Perry of the parcels wanted, I may add to previous correspondence that the lots on which further information is asked and as named and numbered in my communication to the Aiyansh Council, are located as follows:

Those numbered 106 are in the territory thus described:

"Commencing at a point directly opposite the mouth of the Kinshooch River, and following the river down, on its left bank."

Those numbered 115 are in the territory here described:-

"Commencing at an old camping ground at the confluence of the Kinshooch River with the Nass River, following the right bank of the Nass River toward its mouth."

That lot numbered 116 is in the following region:

"Hunting lodge at or about a point midway between the Teketin and Quin-a-dahl rivers, at or near the N. W. boundary of the Preemption Reserve."

No.118 is situated somewhere "down river at a point opposite Kmatkl creek, N. of preemption record No. 1667."

No.119 is also "down river at a point between the S. W. Corner of P.R. No.1667 and in the direction of the S.E. corner of Lot No. 1651."

I sincerely hope I shall have the satisfaction of your early and favourable reply in this connection. If I hear from you that your people desire these parcels, and will be in a position to show them to the surveyor when sent, I will take immediate steps to have the surveyor sent up for the purpose of making the surveys.

Please do not fail to understand that the Provincial Government will not grant us these parcels after December 51st. next and as the time will now be short unless prompt action is taken, your immediate action is desired in this connection.
