HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY.

At a Meeting held at the COMMERCIAL HOTEL, Hamilton, March 16, 1850, Mr. Sheriff Thomas, in the Chair, and Mr. IAS. E. Sabine, Secretary,

It was moved by J. Mathieson, Esq., and seconded by W. P. McLaren, Esq.

Resolved—That it is expedient to form a Horticultural Society, to be called the "Hamilton Horticultural Society," and that the same ho now formed.

Moved by Æ. S. KENNEDY, Esq., and seconded by WILLIAM PRING, Esq.

Resolved—That the following gentlemen be a Committee for drafting a Constitution, and to report generally at a meeting to be held on Saturday next, at 4 o'Clock, P. M. Messrs. McLaren, Mundie, Sabine, Kerr, McNab and Hamilton, with power to add to their number.

At an adjourned Meeting of the "Hamilton Horticul-TURAL SOCIETY," held at the Commercial Hotel, Hamilton, March 23, 1850, Mr. Sheriff Thomas, in the Chair, and Mr. H. B. Bull, Secretary.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read, and confirmed.

The Committee appointed at the last Meeting to draw up a

Constitution, reported, and it having been read was adopted.

Moved by W. P. McLAREN, Esq., seconded by Dr. CRAIGIE, that the election of the Officers of the Society be now proceeded with, and that they hold their several offices, until the Annual Election, the 2nd Tuesday in January.
