railway men, and gas light by no means absolutely safe; finally we got to an electric system, which is in use on some of the most important trains in the Old World. So confident were the railways that they immediately ripped out all other means of artificial lighting, relying entirely upon the system now adopted by the Grand Trunk. The system is safe, economical, clean, reliable, cool, provides power for electric fans, cigar lighters, hair curlers, hot water, cooking and heating if desired, in fact the English Government has even gone so far as to use the power in the Government postal cars for melting the wax for sealing the mail bags en route, all without any appreciable effect on the motive power. The system is one consisting of a dynamo driven by a belt from a pulley carried on truck axle, with two sets of storage batteries, (also carried underneath the car) to take care of the lighting, etc., when car is at rest.
