TELEGRAPHIC.

FRANCE.

Paris, July 27.—The Catholic journals publish the letter of the Archibishop of Paris to the members of the Senate, protesting in the name of liberty against the trial.

Memphis, July 28.—*L'Ordre* insists on the validity of the recent resolution of the Bonapartie leaders declaring Prince Jean-Napoleon head of the Bonapartie family as being official. A declaration of the Bonapartie party, inviting those who no longer belong to that party to declare their position. This shows Rouher, after two weeks of inaction, has again taken the field to enforce obedience on his numerous colleagues. It does not, however, look as if his efforts will succeed.

Paris, July 28.—Article 7 of the Education Bill was skipped over by the Senatorial Committee, as its consideration will absorb the entire sitting. There is widespread belief that President Grey is hovering about the difficulty of enforcing it, would seriously concern him if it were rejected.
