of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HALLIFAX, on the Fifth Day of December, 1785, in the Twenty Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations unto the Twenty Fifth Day of February, 1790, in the Thirtieth Year of his Majesty's Reign, being the Fourth Session of the Sixth General Assembly, convened in the said Province.

CAP. I.

AN ACT to provide for the Support and Maintenance of his Majesty's Government in this Province by reviving, amending and continuing the several Laws for raising a Revenue hereinaster particularly mentioned and expressed.

HEREAS the several Asts of this Province bereinaster mentioned, have expired on the Thirty First Day of March last, and it is expedient, that the same should be revived, continued, altered and amended, in such Manner as is beroin after expressed.

I. Be it therefore Enacted, by the Lieutanant, Governor, Council and Assembly, That the Act made in the Twenty fourth Year of his prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled, an Act for the more effectually raising a Revenue within this Province, for the Support of its Government, and every Matter, Clause and Thing therein contained, as altered and amended in, and by an Act made in the Twenty Ninth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, which Acts expired the Thirty First Day of Mance last, shall be revived, and the same are hereby revived in full Force and virtue from and after the Publication hereof, and the same and every Part thereof so revived as aforesaid, are hereby F f
