"The council of the Yukon territory, or any such subcommittee thereof or of any of the council of public instruction appointed for that purpose, shall constitute a quorum of the council of puhlic instruction, but no general regulations respecting."

Another Oil Field.

Indianapolis, Feb. 12. - A special from Hartford City, Ind., says: Great excitement among oil speculators continues here. Everybody is oil mad. Never in the history of the Indiana oil fields has there been so much excitement as today. Already the prices of everything in the little village of Dundee, nine miles north of this city, have increased to a price that startles the prospector. Yesterday it was only a speck on the map, today it is the center of the most wonderful oil field in the United States. Indeed, it is the opinion of the oil men that it will prove the most valuable in the world's history of oil operations. The Dundce well, owned by the Standard Oil company, which has wrought all this unexpected change, came in yesterday at a depth of over a thousand feet.

It was unexpected, and, like a shot from 10-inch gun, blew away the oil saver and casting head and sent a solid stream of, foamy, yellow oil 61/2 inches in diameter over the 72-foot derrick.

Last night and all day today there has been a seemingly never ending line of wagons, buggies, sleighs, and buckboards.
