The 'Marie Celeste' Mystery.

IS IT SOLVED?

Never has there been a more profound mystery of the sea than that of the brigantine Marie Celeste, and for over forty years the almost unaccountable story has exercised a deep fascination on countless minds. Now, despite certain improbabilities, the seemingly impenetrable veil is stated to have been lifted, and in dramatic circumstances.

In an enthralling article which purports to be the full story is given from the pen of the sole survivor. The remarkable document was sent to the Strand Magazine by Mr. A. Howard Lintor, the headmaster of Peterborough Lodge, the largest preparatory school in Hampstead, London, into whose charge it was committed, along with other papers, by an old servant, named Abel Foadyk, on his deathbed.

The Marie Celeste, well known in every way, sailed from New York in the autumn of 1872, a year notorious in shipping annals for the tremendous storms that raged in the Atlantic—and on December 31st of the same year the British barge Dei Gratia picked her up abandoned on the high seas and towed her to Gibraltar.

About this derelict, however, was something very singular. The Marie Celeste, a staunch ship, was as spick and span as on the day she cleared port; everything aboard was in perfect order—simply the crew had vanished in some inexplicable manner.

Path of Sun.

ITS RELATION TO THE ECLIPSES OF THE YEAR.

The sun's path is called the ecliptic. It is a great circle of the celestial sphere, cutting the celestial equator at two points 180 degrees apart and making with it an angle of 23 1/2 degrees known as the obliquity of the ecliptic. The crossing points are called the equinoxes, because the days and nights are then equal, and the points midway between the equinoxes are the solstices, because the sun then seems to stand still for a few days.

The ecliptic is so called because the eclipses occur only when the moon is crossing it or is near it, for the moon's orbit cuts the ecliptic in two points called nodes or knots, and at other times is above or below it. In the moon, when in either node, is in line with the sun and the earth we have an eclipse, either total or annular. If she is near her node we have a partial eclipse.

The moon's nodes are not stationary, but move backward on the moon's orbit, completing a revolution in about 19 years, when the eclipses of the period recur in the same intervals as before. This period of 18 years and 11 days is called the saros. It was known to the Chaldeans and the Greeks and gave them their data for computing eclipses.

High Prices.

The following letter written by Mr. Elliot Woodworth, of Parrsboro, formerly of Grand Pre, to the Halifax Mail, will be found interesting reading:

Sir—Sir Wilfrid Laurier, as leader of the opposition, has recognized the urgent need of a new rallying cry. He has proved that reciprocity is not a word to conjure with, and he has found that opposition to the naval aid bill arouses little enthusiasm among people of British descent. He has therefore chosen 'tariff reduction' as his battle cry, and he claims that it is a panacea for the increased cost of living. This cry has the two-fold advantage of appealing to all classes, and of affording an opportunity to ceasure the government for a condition that is world-wide. For fifteen years Sir Wilfrid was in a position to apply his tariff reduction remedy, and one of his first acts was to increase the duty on a class of food products used in every household. Even the much vaunted British preference was judged and annulled until it is scarcely recognizable. For instance, the reduction of duty on cloth and clothing instead of being one third of the general tariff, is only one-reventh, and those goods constitute a large part of the importations from Great Britain.

Raising False Hopes.

American newspapers that cheered Sir Wilfrid Laurier on when he was in the midst of his endeavors for the Tait policy to 'make Canada only an adjunct of the United States' are more dispassionate critics of the line he is at present carrying. The New York Tribune does not think much of his 'free food' idea, and does not see how the Canadian people can be expected to think much of it. This is what the Tribune has to say about the policy—

'The high cost of living continues its disturbing advance in Canada as well as here, and Sir Wilfrid Laurier, having no trusts—meat, cold storage or other—to attack there, has fastened upon the poor old tariff as his scapegoat. In his fight for 'free food' he is not to be deterred, apparently, by the case of the tariff reformers at Washington, whose inability to stem the tide of high prices by this method they themselves freely admit.
