### MADAM AND MADAME.

To the Editor of The Gleaner.  
 Sir—(Madam and Madame) is a French form of address, and is used in English only when followed by a name as Madame or Miss Letellier. Madam is used in English only when it is used as a title, as in the case of a French woman (and sometimes before the name of a woman of foreign birth) is merely a matter of courtesy. The same principle is frequently followed in the case of a man of foreign birth, the French form Monsieur, usually represented by the single letter M., being placed before the name, instead of the English form Mr.  
 The writer has noticed a custom, although not a general one, of distinguishing between a daughter-in-law and her mother-in-law by calling the younger woman Mrs. So-and-so, and the elder, Mde. So-and-so.  
 There is no plural of the English word Madam, nor of the form Mrs. (formerly pronounced Mistress), so the French plural Mesdames (literally My Ladies) is used for the plural of Madam. Exalted! Instead of referring to Mrs. Brown, Mrs. Smith and Mrs. Jones, the form used is Mesdames Brown, Smith and Jones.

In addressing one woman in either speaking or writing, the form Madam is employed. It is quite inaccurate to say lady, especially if addressed to a person of rank. The latter mistake may be due to the fact that in French Madam stands for either of the English forms Mr. or Sir.

### GOLD, TAXATION, ETC.

To the Editor of The Gleaner.  
 Sir—There appeared in the press recently an article entitled "What the Gold is as the Bible by A. Canadian." The first question he sets forth in his article is: "What would the consequences be if the government of Canada today ordered the banks to pay gold to any depositor who asked for it?"

I will answer his question by asking him, "What would the consequences be if a farmer had entered a wheat pool and had promised to deliver to the 'pool' 15,000 bushels of wheat (having received value therefor) and when delivery was ordered he found he had only five thousand bushels to settle his indebtedness with? Our answer is: We would pity the poor farmer because the banks would treat him as insolvent."

The second question in his article is: "What practical steps should the federal government take to get the country back to its normal condition?" A Canadian suggests an equitable form of taxation—for what? To pay off privileges, extended to wealthy corporations? "Good Lord, deliver us." From all addition, privy conspiracy and rebellion; from all false doctrine, heresy and schism; from hardness of heart and contempt of thy Word and Commandment.

"Good Lord deliver us." Lloyd George says that "deception is always a contemptible vice, but to deceive the poor is the meanest of all crimes."

In the place of aristocracy of wealth we must have aristocracy of character and intellect.  
 Our unit of value is gold and our medium of exchange is impaired just as far as it fails to measure up to the terms of our standards of gold.

In October, 1920, the note circulation of our chartered banks amounted to \$29,000,000 and against this the banks held \$75,000,000 in gold—herein lies the cause of the H. C. L.  
 The banks are using their note issues as token of wealth and are getting interest thereon on a like basis.  
 What shall it profit a country if it gain a large debt and lose its national credit?

Where does the producer of wealth come in one the deal—the farmer?

### TARIFF DUTIES

 Sir—I would like to draw attention to the fact that the farmers who want the tariff duties on agricultural implements removed are now in enjoyment of the lowest rates on these articles that have been imposed for half a century. On an importation of farm implements during the year 1920, amounting in value to \$25,250,000, the average duty was 7 1/2 per cent. That is a low rate, even for a tariff for revenue only, and certainly does not warrant the outcry against Customs exactions.

### RAILWAY IN FOREST

Paper Concern is to Build a Line for the Exit of Lumber.  
 Bangor, Me., March 21.—The heart of the dense forests above Moose Head Lake is to be penetrated by a railroad built by the Great Northern Paper Company from Sebomook to St. John Pond, 18 miles north. The line is to be of regulation broad gauge and will facilitate the getting out of lumber in the St. John river headwaters region, which ordinarily would be floated down the river.

In addition to the main line there will be numerous branches from one to three miles in length, and it is understood the company plans the extension of the main line to the Canadian border eventually.
