

Washington Oct. 4.—In the face of a growing popularity of all-theear around water sports, the annual eport of the American Red Cross today revealed that there is a gradual decline in the thousands who died annually by accidental drownging in the United States. This is due, in its opinion, to the adding of 22,892 swimmers trained in water life saving science to the thousands the Red Cross has already enrolled in Life

The slogan "Every child a swimmer" has been adopted, the movement gaining 280,000 more children than enrolled the year previous, with 5,884,907 school children embraced in the work on June 30, this year.

Hand in hand with this service the report showed that the Red Cross, through its chapters, maintains a corps of 924 public health nurses on duty throughout the country, whose function is to assist in developing and maintaining the health of the communities tey serve. In the last year these nurses made 1.099.492 home calls; visited 83,348 schools and inspected 1,473,031 children.

Co-operating in military prepared ness, the report said, chief nurses have been assigned to 23 general, 11 evacuation, and four surgical hospitals and one station. The Red Cross Nursing Service showed a total enrollment on June 30 of 42,000, an increase of 1,366 over last year. Abroad, Nursing Service work, embracing development of nursing standards, education in health, sanitation, child welfare, instruction in home hygiene and care of the sick, is being carried forward in Poland, Bulgaria, Turkey, Greece, the Philippines, Canal Zone, Haiti, the Virgin Islands, Hawaii and Albania. Philadelphia, Oct. 30.-Woman's scendancy in England and the United States proves these nations to se in bad shape, according to Sir W: Blair Bell, famous English sychologist and surgeon. Feminine ascendancy, he said, is an indication that men are deteriorating—that they lack vitality.
