## TO MAKE SPAIN AN ISLAND.

An extraordinary scheme is being planned by France, one that if carried out, will give her a great commercial and naval advantage. This is the plan of building an immense canal to connect the Atlantic and the Mediterranean ports without subjecting itself to the guns of Gibraltar. The canal exists already for small boats and small coasters. To enlarge it for war ships and merchantmen is no mere dream. Since 1878 "the canal of the two seas" has been fully planned by engineers. Three parliamentary commissions have made estimates upon it and now M. Gauthier, minister of public works, has sent his own commission to make final studies of the scheme. Its conclusions are to be submitted to the lower house for action. To complete this enormous work eight years will be required, and the cost is estimated at a minimum of \$160,000,000. But about the new canal there will be two features of more than passing interest. One of these will be the fact that locomotives will be used for towing the huge vessels through the canal. The other is that instead of ordinary locks it is suggested that ship elevators be employed. This device consists of two huge metallic basins. Imagine one at the top of its lock, the other at the bottom. An ascending ship is towed into the upper basin. The weights are almost counterbalanced. To make the upper basin descend and lift the lower one by its superior weight in descending it will be necessary only to turn an extra quantity of water into it. The principle is that of the old fashioned lock. The improvement will consist of saving time and water.

## TWO ACCIDENTS ON THE I. C. R.

**Wilbur's Special Smashed up at Humphrey's—Run-off Near Harcourt.**

Moncton, April 4.—Two accidents took place yesterday on the I. C. R. The first, a smash in Con. Wilbur's freight special at Humphrey's Mills resulted in considerable damage to a number of cars, while the second, the run-off of Con. Card's special at Harcourt, was not attended by serious consequences.

The accident at Humphrey's occurred in the early morning hours, but it was not until afternoon that the line was cleared. Some shunting was being done, when the train passed and a minute later the two sections crashed together. A couple of cars of coal were smashed and the rest spilled and other cars more or less damaged. An auxiliary was sent out and the damage repaired.

Late yesterday afternoon three or four cars on Con. Card's east bound special left the rails near Harcourt, occasioning a bad mixup, resulting in a blockage of the road till after midnight. The run-off occurred about four or five o'clock, and the auxiliary crew was sent out from Moncton to the scene. No person was injured seriously, but Con. Card and Brakeman Hatchey were pretty badly shaken up. The cars were considerably damaged and the track torn up. The Maritime express for Montreal was delayed about two hours and a half by the blockage. The line was clear this morning and the track repaired. Driver Geo. Stone was in the cab.


