



A St. Petersburg correspondent says that when General Kauffman represented to the Czar the impossibility of preparing a new Central'Asian expedition without cash and supplies, he received the significent answer that it was perhaps better not to proceed with the preparations. A pro-posal to furnish the pretender to the Afghan throne with money, for the purpose of intriguing among the Afghan chiefs, met with an absolute refusal. The irrita-tion against Lord Salisbury's speech has subsided, although the question has been even raised of withdrawing the Russian Ambassdor from London.
