Richard the Third Killed in Bosworth Battle.

On August 22, 1485, Richard the Third, King of England, the last of the three of the House of York, was defeated and killed at the battle of Bos worth, in Leicestershire. His wife and son had died, and Richard was slain by the army of Henry, Earl of Richmond, who succeeded him as Henry the Seventh, the first of the five English sovereigns of the House of Tudor. King Richard's remains were buried in the monastery of the Grey Friars at Leicestershire, but his tomb was destroyed when the monasteries were abolished, while the Reformation was approaching. plain our fishermen are catching considerable quantities of Haddock this year. This is a fish that frequents Nova Scotian waters, but here in Newfoundland it is generally a curios ity to find a scattered one landed at a fishing stage during the day. The Haddock, Hake, Ling, Cusk, and Pollock are all members of the same family species as the codfish, but for some reason or another are of a low er grade. The Haddock to the Codfish as a desirable article of and when salted this toughness acts oned about half the value of Prime Salt Codfish. Smoked Haddock o Haddies, as they were originally call ed in Scotland, have made a world wide name for themselves, on their merit, as being very much nicer than smoked codfish and for a fancy dish command high prices. As Haddock are so uncertain in Newfoundland waters, we would not recommend anyone to go to heavy initial expenses of smoking them, but the fishermen should know that conneisseurs look upon fresh Haddock for immediate use, from an epicurean standpoint, as even better than fresh codfish and in many first class fresh fish shops in Canada and the United States you will have to pay a higher price for it.






