

President Coolidge during the week eding the 2nd June instant, the following paragraph appears: The President transmitted to the Senate lation of Secretary Hughe that United States sovereignty be extended over Swain's Island, a little speck of land off the Bonavista Bay district of Newfoundland, not far from Greenspond Island It was discovered by a Briton who deeded it to an American. Great Britain does not contest our sovereignty." Greenspond Island is in Bonavista Bay not far from Pool's Harbor and Wesleyville, quite close to shore, and no doubt the small island shown on the maps, close to and south of the larger one, is Swain's Island. Both are not far from Cabot Island and were within sight of the

first land discovered by that famous navigator. "John Cabot, sailing from Bristol in 1497, appears to have made landfall at Bonavista and claimed the whole country for Henry VII." Since that date there is nothing to indicate a change of "sovereignty" except the President's message.

Questions of this kind fall within the domain of public international law, of which it may broadly be said that apart from contractual obligations established by treaty, the science deals with a theory rather than a condition.
