As all the Great Powers are anxious to pre-serve peace, it is reasonable to suppose that some sort of compromise will be forced upon both beligcrents. For some unexplained reason the Greecian Ambas-ador, whoit was supposed would repre-sent Greece in the Conference, has been refused participation in the session. He has protested against his exclusion, and appealed to the Greecian Governmeit at thes for instructions. The Conference will await the action of Greece in this matter. This may cause some temporary trouble, but we do not think it will per-manently affect the objects sought for.
