In 1868 the expenditures amounted to \$1,183,852; in 1869, \$1,444,608; in 1870, \$1,580,663; and in 1871, to \$1,816,866—an average yearly increase of about \$211,000! In 1872 under the Blake and Mowat Govern ments, the expenditures totalled \$1,847,956, or \$31,109 only in excess of the last year's expenses under the Sandfield regime—a wide difference in favour of the economy of Reform rule, being a saving of \$180,000 on the annual ' natural" increase of the public expenditure under the par imoniously economical Sandfield administration! A charge of recklessness and extravagance against a Govern ment able to point to a record like the above comes with very bad grace indeed from the eulogists of Patent Combination "economists."

Another method adopted by the Tory Opposition to endavour to damage the Reform Government in the eyes of the people, is to take the actual expenditure for 1872-1.847. 956, and compare it with the estimated expenditure of 1873-\$2,771,023, and point to the increase of some \$900,000 as a proof of the reckless prodigality of Reformers. But a simple appli cation of the same rule to the model economist's accounts disposes of this piece of deception, and leaves the balance still largely in favour of the present Government. Take, for inance, the estimates of 1871-the last year of the Patent Combination -\$2,581,560, and compare them with the actual expenses for 1870—81, 80, 683, and we find that the economy of the "model" government exhibited itself in a sudden excess of more than one million dollars!

It will be seen from the above ex hibit that the balance of economy and careful husbanding of the re sources of the Province is greatly in favor of Reform rule. But why pursue the subject further. The fact is patent to the people, and all the untruthful abuse of the Opposition press will not convince them to the
