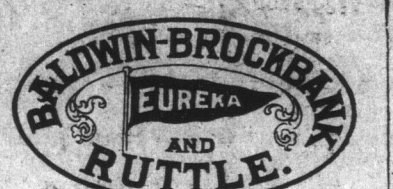

### KOVIACH IS TO HANG. Hungarian Doomed to the Gallows at Prince Albert for Murder of Charles Bruggenote.

Prince Albert, Sask., April 26.—Emerle Koviach was sentenced to death for the murder of Charles Bruggenote. After listening to the evidence for three days in what was described by the prosecuting counsel as one of the most cold-blooded and mysterious murders in the criminal annals of the northwest, the jury, at midnight, last night returned a verdict of guilty of murder. Koviach, who is a Hungarian, is about 38 years of age. The motive assigned for the crime was that Koviach in his own defense told precisely the same story of the murder, except that it was Bruggenote and not himself, that had entered the man's brains and drove him in the night into the prairie. Chief Justice Haultain passed sentence of death on Koviach. Bruggenote was indicted on the charge of taking part in the murder.

### BRYAN PLEDGED HIS SUPPORT TO U. S. AGRICULTURAL COMMISSION.

New York, April 25.—W. J. Bryan pledges the hearty support of his department to the American commission on agriculture, which starts tomorrow to investigate systems of farm credits in European countries. A message from him to the secretary of the commission, given in the commission's honor, at which Secretary Houston, of the department of agriculture, was a guest and spoke, and as was also Walter H. Page, ambassador to Great Britain. The latter said he hoped to welcome the commission personally and officially at the American embassy in London in July. Nearly every state and Canadian province was represented at the dinner by men interested in the production of farmers' banking system in the United States. Besides Secretary Houston and Ambassador Page, the speakers included United States Senator Thomas P. Gore of Oklahoma and Duncan Fletcher of Florida, who are federal members of the commission; Walter Scott, premier of Saskatchewan, representing Canada; and John Barrett, director-general of the Pan-American union.

### Archives Enriched by Important Papers

Ottawa, April 27.—With the arrival of a further instalment, which completes the collection, the Canadian archives are now in possession of an important series of documents, viz.: the private papers of the late Joseph Howe, the Nova Scotia statesman, who played such a large part in the history of Canada at the time of confederation. The papers comprise some 40 volumes of journals, letters and editorials, and furnish a splendid outline of the political history of Nova Scotia up to the time of confederation. The entrance of the maritime province into the newly formed dominion, is generally known, was attended by difficulties which the political documents of the archives, from the family of the great statesman illuminate.

### Bethlehem Steel's Purchase Confirmed

New York, April 25.—The Bethlehem Steel Co. has purchased the Fore River Shipbuilding company of Quincy, Mass., a \$4,800,000 corporation, builders of battleships and other war craft. The purchase was confirmed today at the offices of the Bethlehem Steel Co. in Philadelphia. The Fore River company said they preferred that official announcement be made at the same time as the purchase of the Fore River company.

### PUSHED WRONG BUTTON, AND SENT IN FIRE ALARM

Didsbury Homesteader Creates Consternation in King George Hotel in Effort to Get Elevator Service.

When Gus Lindquist, fresh from his homestead near Didsbury, wandered into the King George hotel on Saturday afternoon and asked to be directed to the room of a machinist man with whom he was transacting some business, he wasn't looking for any notoriety. In fact, all he wanted to do was get his business transacted and get back to the land, for Gus, used to his homesteader's shack, was very much at sea in the King George.

Piloted by a brass-buttoned bell-hop, he had no difficulty in finding his man in a room on the top floor of the hotel, and in a few minutes his business transaction was over. Then came the return journey, and it was here that Lindquist achieved much notoriety and caused no little consternation to the other guests of the hotel as well as to hundreds of Calgary citizens.

On the way, the homesteader had noticed that when the bell-hop wanted the elevator he merely pressed a button and the cage came up, swiftly and silently, and carried them to the top floor. To get down, he figured out that he had to repeat this performance but when he looked for a bell button he couldn't find one. He looked on the floor and up at the ceiling. Then his gaze wandered to the walls and he saw a big button. Gus pressed it once, immediately a bell buzzed and a gong clanged. Again the homesteader pressed the button, and this time he was answered by the scream of the siren and the clang of the gongs of the fire apparatus from the central hall. It mattered not to Gus that he had thrown the guests of the hotel into a small sized panic or that he had turned three firemen's heads toward him, for he had caused a crowd of several hundred people to gather in front of the hotel to watch the firemen at work. Gus wanted to reach the ground floor and get out into the open and back to Didsbury, and it was not until three firemen arrived breathless and shouting, and carried them to the top floor at the top floor of the hotel and found Lindquist still burning in the fire alarm that he knew he had done something of the ordinary.

"I ban wanting the elevator," he said meekly when asked what he was doing. "I ban watch that young feller press a button and da car come up and I ban want the car to come for me. I want to go home to Didsbury." But Gus goes to the place where the perspiring firemen congregate, him he'll never reach Didsbury.

### COLLECTS DAMAGES FROM FELLOW CHAUFFEUR

Judge Stuart Gives Interesting Talk on the Rule of the Road in Giving Judgment.

In rendering his decision in the case of Thomas W. Ward, Mr. Justice Stuart gave some interesting pointers on the rule of the road. The case was one in which two chauffeurs driving westward proceeded along Eighth street west and collided on Mount Royal hill. Damages were granted against the defendant for the sum of \$150, though \$100 was claimed. After hearing the evidence in court, the judge himself went to the scene of the accident and examined the place where it took place.

In giving judgment, the judge said that the evidence showed that the defendant was going on the left side of the road. His excuse was that he was doing so in order to see beyond the hill on the other side if anyone were coming down the street to pass him. The judge, however, was of the opinion that the defendant kept too long on the left side of the road and should have crossed back to the proper side after he had passed the hill.

Speed Was Too High. On the plaintiff's side, the judge contended, according to the evidence, was going at too high a rate of speed down the hill and for that reason he was not allowed any credit in the action; yet that was the only fault attributable to the plaintiff.

It had been stated also that the defendant was no more than 100 feet within the left side of the road, and there was for that reason room for the other car. The judge held, however, that the room was so limited that the defendant, coming from a distance, could not be expected to see it at once, in the matter of turning the law as he interpreted it, meant that a driver should turn to the right in a reasonable time, that had not been done by the plaintiff, and for that reason the damages were granted against the defendant.

### PRAYERS OFFERED FOR NEW CHINESE REPUBLIC

Calgary Churches Join With Whole World in Welcoming the New Republic of China and to Express the Hope of Enlightenment in Mongolian Empire and Pray for Its Success.

Calgary churches yesterday joined with Christian churches the world over in prayers specially prepared for the occasion for the youthful republic which has been established in China. Many preachers also took occasion to refer to the missionary work which had been done by Christian churches in China and to express the hope that the enlightenment which would be brought into the country under such a progressive government as had at last been established there after long years of misery and darkness would be the means of civilizing and Christianizing the people far more rapidly than ever been dreamt of by the fideist missionaries.

In St. Johns Anglican church Rev. Mr. H. H. H. preached at the morning service on China and the great possibilities which were brought within reason by the establishment of a republic in the country materially and at the same time morally.
