The three were Peter Jackson, Young Grifo and Fitzsimmons. These three, all invincible in their line despite their frailties, were beloved from one end of the great Australian country to the other.

Jackson lived in San Francisco for a long while, and it was there he met Corbett and other famous fighters.

When his career ended and he returned from California to his native land he met with perhaps the most wonderful reception ever accorded a prize fighter.

Crowds met him at the wharf on his arrival at Sydney and escorted him to Tattersalls, where a formal reception was tendered the old pugilist.

When he quit the steamer for his native shore, Peter's pockets were empty. Before he reached Tattersalls they were filled to the brim with enough gold to keep him in ease and luxury even through the balance of his life.

CIVIC ELECTION FOR MAYOR, ALDERMEN, SCHOOL TRUSTEES AND POLICE COMMISSIONERS

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the electors of the Municipality of Fernie, and Fernie School District, that I require the presence of the said Electors at the Council Chamber, City Hall, Pellatt Avenue, Fernie, British Columbia, on the Fourteenth day of January, 1918, at twelve o'clock noon Coast Time (One o'clock P. M. Local Time) for the purpose of electing persons to represent them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen and in the School Board as School Trustees, and on the Board of Police Commissioners as Police Commissioners.

The mode of nomination of candidates shall be as follows:

The candidates shall be nominated in writing; the writing shall be subscribed by two voters of the Municipality as proposer and seconder, and shall be delivered to the Returning Officer at any time between the date of the notice and two P.M. Coast Time (Three P.M. Local Time) of the day of nomination; the said writing may be in the form numbered 5 in the Schedule of this Act (Municipal Elections Act), and shall state the names, residence and occupation or description of each person proposed, in such manner as sufficiently to identify such candidate; and in the event of a poll being necessary such poll will be opened on the Seventeenth day of January, A.D. 1918, at the Council Chamber, City Hall, Pellatt Avenue, Fernie, British Columbia, of which every person is hereby required to take notice and govern himself and herself accordingly.

Qualification for Mayor

Any person who is a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years not disqualified under any law, and has for the six months next preceding the day of nomination been the registered owner, in the Land Registry Office, of land or real property in the City, of the Assessed Value, on the last Municipal Assessment Roll of one thousand dollars or more, over and above any registered judgment or charge, and who is otherwise duly qualified as a Municipal Voter.

Qualification for Alderman

Any person who is a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years, not disqualified under any law, and has for the six months next preceding the day of nomination been the registered owner, of land or real property in the City of Fernie, of the Assessed Value, on the last Municipal Assessment Roll, of five hundred dollars or more, over and above any registered judgment or charge, and who is otherwise duly qualified as a Municipal Voter.

Qualification for School Trustee

Any person who is a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years actually residing within the District, and having been for the six months next preceding the date of nomination the registered owner, in the Land Registry Office of land or real property in the Fernie School District of the Assessed Value, on the last Municipal Assessment Roll, of five hundred dollars or more, over and above any registered judgment or charge, and being otherwise qualified to vote at an election of School Trustees in the said Fernie School District.

Qualification for Police Commissioner

Must be a British subject.

Notice is hereby given that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of British Columbia at its next session for an Act to incorporate an Association known as The Engineering and Technical Institute of B.C., with power to promote and increase the knowledge, skill and proficiency of its members in all things relating to the architectural, engineering, surveying and technical professions and to that end to establish and conduct examinations and prescribe such tests of competency and moral character as may be thought expedient and to grant certificates of membership to those approved of and to purchase or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property for the purpose of the Institute and to dispose thereof and reinvest the proceeds in such manner as may seem fit, and to fix entrance fees and annual fees or subscriptions to be paid by the members and to vary the same from time to time, and to provide for the management of its affairs by council to be constituted in such manner as may be provided by by-law, and to have its head office and hold its annual meetings within British Columbia, and to have, enjoy and exercise all powers, rights and privileges necessary, usual or incidental to all or any of the aforesaid purposes.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only, but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10 an acre.

For full information application should be made to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, or to any Agent or Sub-Agent of Dominion Lands.

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS

Coal mining rights of the Dominion, in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the North-West Territories and in a portion of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 per acre. Not more than 2,560 will be leased to one applicant.

Application for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-Agent of the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

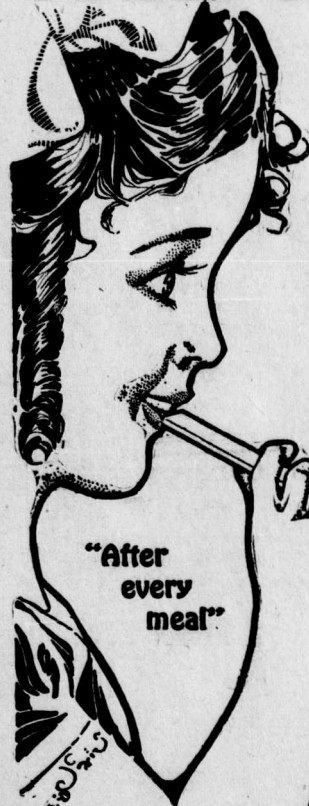
