The morning session was called to order by President Lake, who appointed the usual committees. The committee on credentials reported in favor of the following delegates: New York, W. S. Donnelly, A. Panama, March 29.—Tremendous fighting marks the progress of the war in Honduras. News has just been received of a battle at Tatungla, which resulted in the defeat of the Government troops with a loss of more than 100 men killed. Nearly 50 of the revolutionary soldiers were killed, and after the battle the bodies of all the dead men were collected in a heap and burned. Gen. Sierra, the victor, has advanced nearer to Tegueigalpa, and is preparing to attack that city. The revolutionary forces are strong. Anarchy, terror and despair are rampant in Tegueigalpa, Wives and children of absent revolutionists have been imprisoned and subjected to frightful tortures. Assaults of the most revolting character have been committed.
