CANADA'S GROWTH HAD KIDNEY HELPS SHIPPING

Cunards to Maintain Fortnightly Service to Dominion.

WITH NEW TERMINUS

essels Will Be Built for Second and Third Class Passengers Only for Big Exodus.

London, May 8.—Shipping develop-ments as affecting the Atlantic routes, and especially the St. Lawrence trade, are being watched with great inter-est, particularly as on the expiration of the provisional agreement between the British and continental lines there is danger of another rate war com-

the British and continental lines there is danger of another rate war commencing in July. Immediate interest, however, centres in the starting of the first Cunard vessel from Southampton for Canadian ports, a service that is to be maintained fortnightly hereafter, by three vessels, the Gerons, Tortona and Cairnrona, bought from the Thomson Line and renamed the Ascania, Ausonia and Albania. The Albania has commenced the new service and the Ausonia and Ascania will follow in turn. All are fitted with Marconi wireless telegraphy and marine signaling apparatus. They really start from London with a cargo and a few passengers, but the bulk of the passengers shipped at Southampton, especially the mid-European emigrants for Canadia, who are outside the reach of the northern or the Mediterranean emigrant lines

The move is a further indication of the growing importance of Southampton in British passenger traftic. Part of the growth is due to the advantage cous position of the southern port for tapping the continent, but another advantage is the nearness of London as a base of operations and the fact that the Thames cannot be used by such big ships as can find accommodation at Southampton. It is confidently believed in Southampton that the great liners of the Cunard Company will presently transfer their terminus thither from Liverpool so as to compete with the Olympic and Titanic, now constructing for the White Star, and the ocean monsters ordered for the German lines.

A striking feature in the development of the Canadian passenger traffic is the preparation of vessels with second cabin and third-class accommodation only. The Allan line has so arranged the Ionian, and is now adopting the Scotian, bought for the St. Lawrence route from the Holland-America line. The Teutonic, transferred from the Southampton-New York route, by the White Star Line, is being reconstructed also on this plan. Then she will be under the same conditions as the Canada and Dominion of that company.
