It has been found that the endeavor to establish this distinction by making it illegal to use the adjective "trained" or the adjective "registered" by any person who is not a graduate of a legally-established training school is insufficient. In the State of New York, therefore, a bill has been introduced into the legislature which reads: "No man or woman to 'hire himself or herself out as a nurse, or to use the term nurse,' unless such person shall be a graduate of a training school approved by the board of health of the State of New York." The bill does not prevent others than hospital school graduates from attending sick persons, or assisting physicians in the sick-room, but such persons must call themselves "attendants," and not "nurses." With the object of this bill we are in hearty sympathy. There is a distinct and valuable function which is filled by the nurse who is registered, and can perform; the schools that are educating them ought to go right on educating them; it would be a misfortune to a good many of them if they were prevented from attending the sick, but when a physi-
