

"In the meantime," he continued, "any compromise

with the Bolshevik creed is but a league with death. But in such doctrines of class rule and class hatred, and those which have been made, there is a gulf as wide as that between truth and falsehood, right and wrong, life and death."

Mr. Davis' address was given after he was given the honorary degree of doctor of laws and the honorary degree of master of arts was conferred on Maude Adams, actress, the first woman to receive an honorary degree from Union


