TO FEDERATE EUROPE. Mr. stancie William Fox, in the Daily News, suggests that, in addition to The Hague international consultative court should be established for dealing with the settlement of international questions; and that its constitution might include the prime ministers or chancellors, together with their respective ministers for for-eign affairs, of Germany, France, Great Britain, Russis, Anstria, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Holland, Belgium, Denmark, Switzerland, Sweden, Norway, Greece, and Roumaria. Mf. Fox suggests, further, that the president of the court should be chosen alternately from the prime minis-ters or chancellors of Germany, Great Britain, France, Russia, Austria, and Italy; and that except for special reasons, the court should meet every two years.
