The delegates came in from nearly all of the 373 lodges in all parts of nearly all of the 373 lodges in all parts of this province last night, and fully 400 members of the order are expected to be in attendance to-day. The Grand Lodge of Quebec has been formed since the last Ontario Grand Lodge meeting, which takes away nearly 2000 members and 44 lodges from the Ontario jurisdiction. The report of Grand Master Workman F. G. Inwood of this city shows the net growth of the of this city shows the net growth of the order in Ontario for 1893 to have been 1497, giving a total membership at the end of last year of 27,361.

There is a widely expressed desire among the subordinate lodge representatives for separation from the Supreme Lodge of the United States, as the annual calls of the relief society of that supreme body are very considerable amounts.
