

THE RED RIVER AND NORTH-WEST REGISTER.

The "Register" commences as a monthly publication, devoted to the interests of intending settlers and investors in the North-West. Being neither politicians nor speculators, and having no interest in the settlement or growth of any particular locality, our aim will be to write the truth about the country, its climate, soil, and productions, the progress of settlement in the various districts; giving instances of individual progress as illustrations of settler's life on the prairies. With a view to supplement the usefulness of the Register, we have supplied ourselves with maps of all the surveyed townships in the country, as well as of the River Belts, and have collected from official and private sources, and from personal travel, all the information that can be obtained about these townships and River Belts, such as the character of the surface and soil of each section or lot, whether wooded or prairie, marsh or hay-land, what sections, parts of sections, or lots are homesteaded, pre-empted, purchased or vacant, and for sale; the roads, rivers, lakes, post-offices, schools, churches, stores, mills, names of officials, &c., &c., &c. Any one inquiring at the Head Office, 28 Toronto Street, Toronto, or at the office of publication in Emerson, about any particular lot, will be furnished with an exact copy of the official map of the township or section of river belt where the lot is situated, along with all the statistical information regarding the same. Having made a special business of collecting, preserving and registering such information, on the principle adopted by the mercantile agencies, we can insure the entire reliability of whatever we furnish in the shape of reports and maps. The charge for a copy of a Township map on a scale of 40 chains to the inch, and coloured to indicate the areas of wood, prairie, &c., &c., will be \$1.00. An additional charge of 50 cts. per folio of 100 words will be made for such statistical information as may be asked for. Copies of maps of the River Belts will be furnished in sections, ten inches square, at similar rates. Annual subscribers to the "Register" will be entitled to one map of any Township or section of River Belt they choose, with all the information respecting it at a charge of only 50 cts. While we have no lands of our own to sell, we shall publish occasionally a list of all the lands we know to be in the market, along with the prices asked, and if required will negotiate purchases or sales, charging buyer and seller alike, one per cent. on the price received or paid. Stamps must be enclosed with all orders and letters of inquiry.

The first number of the Register will be issued on the first day of June, 1880.
