- Biographical Notes -

Mr. Carson's career has been devoted to government management. He had a varied background in management and government prior to 1961, at which time he was named to the U.C. Hydro and Power Authority to the Royal Commission on Government Organization to direct the study of government management problems in the Federal Public Service. In 1962 he was loaned to the Treasury Board and in 1963, 1964, 1965 he was appointed Chairman of the Civil Service Commission.

During World War II he was with the Department of Personnel Selection at National Defence Headquarters and subsequently he became senior personnel consultant at D.C. Woods and Gordon. He later served in various capacities with Hydro, B.C. Electric and B.C. Hydro.

He studied at the University of British Columbia and at the University of Toronto (B.A., Philosophy).
