DIPLOMATIC APPOINTMENTS

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Don Jamieson, announces the following diplomatic appointments:

Mr. Arthur G. Campbell, 60, originally from Montreal, to be Ambassador to Norway and concurrently to Iceland.

Mr. Campbell (B.A., McGill University; School of Political Science, Columbia University) has served abroad in Geneva in 1960 and again from 1967-1969 as Minister-Counsellor with the Canadian Delegation to the Disarmament Conference, New Delhi and in Bonn as Minister with the Canadian Embassy. Since 1972 he has served as Ambassador to the Republic of South Africa and concurrently as High Commissioner to Botswana, Lesotho and Swaziland until August 1976.

Mr. Campbell succeeds Mr. Kenneth McIlwraith who returned to Ottawa.

Mr. William M. Wood, 54, originally from Montreal to be Ambassador to the Republic of Zaire and concurrently to Burundi, Rwanda and the People's Republic of the Congo.

Mr. Wood (B.A., McGill University; B.C.L., McGill University) has served abroad in Athens, Brussels, Leopoldville (Kinshasa), Saigon, Paris and as Chargé d'Affaires a.i. in Tel Aviv from 1964 to 1965 and in Port-au-Prince from 1971-74. Since 1974 he has served as Director of the Consular Operations Division.

Mr. Wood succeeds Mr. John Schioler who returned to Ottawa.
