The Order being read for consideration of amendments made by the Senate to Bill No. C-37, An Act respecting Taxation of Estates;

Mr. Fleming (Eglinton), seconded by Mr. Harkness, moved,—That a Message be sent to the Senate to acquaint Their Honours that this House agrees to the amendments made by the Senate to Bill No. C-37, An Act Respecting the Taxation of Estates, with the exception of the fourth amendment to which this House disagrees for the following reasons:—

1. It creates discrimination in favour of a particular class of property.
2. The amendment is unworkable.
3. The amendment will reduce government revenues, and will particularly tend to reduce revenues from estates of larger value.

And that the Clerk of the House do carry the said Message to the Senate.
