MR. F. BELFORD—SPEECHWRITER

Question No. 2,165—**Mr. Cossitt:**

With reference to the answer to question No. 5, that the former minister of national defence, the Hon. Barney Danson, spent \$1100 of public funds to pay Mr. F. Belford for writing a speech given to the Canadian Defence Association (a) what were the qualifications of Mr. Belford (b) for what reasons were departmental officials not used to assist with the speech (c) approximately how many minutes did Mr. Danson take to deliver the speech and what was the resulting cost per minute for the speech?

Mrs. Ursula Appolloni (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of National Defence):

- Mr. Belford's qualifications are not known to the department. He was hired directly by Mr. Danson and any correspondence pertaining to Mr. Belford's qualifications, would be in Mr. Danson's papers in the Archives to which the department has no access.
- In the timeframe in which Mr. Belford was hired, no departmental officials with the specific qualifications of a speechwriter were available to assist Mr. Danson with his speeches. This was primarily due to the recent arrival of Mr. Danson as minister of national defence.
- It is not known how long it took Mr. Danson to deliver the speech. However, its length was 30 type-written pages.
