IMF CONFERENCE—TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Ouestion No. 4,537-Mr. Mazankowski:

- 1. Were transportation services provided by the Government to the IMF Conference held in Toronto in September, 1982 and, if so, what were such services and what was the cost of the services?
- 2. Were private firms hired to provide transportation services and, if so, were tenders accepted for those contracts?
- Hon. Paul J. Cosgrove (Minister of State (Finance)): 1. The following transportation services were provided to the joint annual meetings of the International Monetary Fund and the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development in accordance with the standard requirements of these organizations.
- (a) 180 official cars for Governors and senior IMF/IBRD officials for official use within Metropolitan Toronto. Cars were leased from General Motors Canada for \$1. The cost of gas, maintenance and parking was approximately \$68,125.
- (b) Rental of five cars and two vans from Avis for use as pool cars and standby replacement cars—cost \$8,626.
- (c) Rental of three minibuses for 29 days to transport small groups between Toronto International Airport and the Sheraton Centre Hotel—\$29,025.
