EXCISE TAX ACT

TIME ALLOCATION—BILL C-62

Hon. Marcel Danis (Minister of State (Youth), Minister of State (Fitness and Amateur Sport) and Deputy Leader of the Government in the House) moved:

That regarding Bill C-62, an Act to amend the Excise Tax Act, the Criminal Code, the Customs Act, the Customs Tariff, the Excise Act, the Income Tax Act, the Statistics Act and the Tax Court of Canada Act, one day be allotted to the consideration of the report stage and one day to the consideration of third reading stage of the bill; and that fifteen minutes before the end of each of these stages, any proceedings before the House shall be interrupted, if required, for the purpose of this Order and, in turn, every question necessary to dispose, respectively, of the report stage and third reading shall be put forthwith and successively, without further debate or amendment.

Hon. Michael Wilson (Minister of Finance): Mr. Speaker, I did comment on this time allocation motion in our debate yesterday and I would like to repeat what I said at that time because there are a number of more members in the House.

We have been debating Bill C-62 for some while now. We have had a White Paper, a technical paper, draft legislation, consultations and committee hearings. But I think what we found very clearly demonstrated yesterday was when you, Sir, were asked to go through amendment after amendment which said exactly the same thing. It wasted 15 minutes of time of this House, 15 minutes of time which could have been used by a member for a speech on this bill. It became clear as I listened to you reading through these amendments and to the hon. members opposite saying “no” every time you said: “Shall I dispense?”, that they had absolutely no intention of wanting to debate or discuss this legislation. What they wanted to do was waste the time of the House. This is exactly the same as what we have heard from the members opposite in the New Democratic Party who have made no secret of their motives here. Their motives are very clear, as has been stated by the House Leader and others in the New Democratic Party, that they will use every means within their control to delay, divert, and
