

time, but was not published until 1807. These poems are of surpassing beauty, and the best of them are found in this collection. In the issue of 1800 were also included "Ruth," "Lucy Gray," "Matthew," "The Pet Lamb," and others.

If the first publication of the Lyrical Ballads was received with a mingled feeling of disregard and contempt, the Essay which accompanied the second volume aroused the rage of the critics; for it was a
