## RIVIÈRE-DU-LOUP (EN BAS.)

The Rev. E. A. W. King reports:-

Period—Advent to Advent.

Adult members, 80; children, old and young, 60. Hearers (say), 10. Total, 150 souls. Congregation at Church, 15 to 40 in winter, and 40 to 150 in summer.

At Station school-house, 20 to 45.

Communicants (actual), 30.

Confirmed during the year, 5 men, 4 women, making 9 new members.

Services on Sundays, 108; on festivals and fasts, 30; on other week days, 26, which, with 13 missionary services ontside the parish, make a total of 177, or an average of more than 3 a-week.

Holy Communion celebrated 15 times with attendance of 3 to 25. Lack of sufficient number twice.

Baptisms—local 15, outside 5, making 20. Marriages—local 2, outside 1, making 3. Burials—2.

Contributions for all purposes, \$630.22. Church edifice creditably restored and free from debt. No Parsonage.

Children's service and Sunday School in the afternoon. Scholars and teachers 33. Day school visited often. The visiting from house to house has been frequent. The Bishop and five clergymen from abroad honoured and benefitted the parish by assisting in services and missionary meetings. Here I would gratefully mention the Rev. Mr. Pollard, of Ottawa.
