CURRL:IT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

The lumber market is unchanged. The dealers report export trade good. The demand for shingles is slack, and the market is overstocked. Large quantities of B. C. shingles were brought in at a very low rate during December and January which killed local production, the prices then ruling being very low. Many dealers state that hemlock cannot be brought in at the prices quoted and a profit made thereon.

Heavy shipments from the Georgian Bay are being made to all United States points. The second cargo of lumber ever brought to the Menominee river from Canada was unloaded at Marinette, Wis., last week. The sawmill of the Algoma Commercial Co., at Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., has just cleaned up all of its cut of the past six months or more, at an average price of \$22 a thousand, mill run, buyer to pay the duty. This lumber goes to Buffalo and is being shipped.

The imports of lumber from Canada to Great Britain are increasing. The export for the past six months as given by the British Board of Trade shows an increase in hewn wood of \$50,000 and a decease in sawn wood of \$35,000.

In the Ottawa district the Chaudiere slides are going full blast, immense ratts of timber being floated down in cribs. Several raits have already past through this year. There is no trouble this year in putting the timber through the slides. owing to the improvements made and the high water. Practically all of the log drives have been moved off the Dumoine, Coulonge, Black and Gatineau rivers. It is estimated there were fully 50 per cent. more logs taken off the Coulonge this season than last. This increase is accounted for in part by the fact that all the logs hung up last year were sent through safely this season. On some of the streams the rise of water was four feet. owing to the heavy rains.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Prices remain about stationary in Quebec. The Canadian railroads authorize the announcement that they are again shipping Canadian rossed and shaved pulp wood to the United States. They say that, pressure having been brought to bear upon the United States Treasury Department, the special duty of 35 per cent. on Canadian pulp wood has been withdrawn and they are now accepting shipments of this product as heretofore.

Some heavy sales of lumber as well as timber limits have been made to Americans. A New York syndicate has purchased a tract of 54 miles in the Lake St. John district where they intend to spend considerable money in the development of the property and the manufacture of lumber for the European market.

In Nova Scotie the reports of the great forest fires have been followed by reports of rain and good crop. This has had the effect of causing a better condition in the lumber market. In Cumberland alone the lumbermen have lost nearly half a million dollars. Among the areas burned are: At River Hebert 15.000 acres of J. Newton Pugsley, and large tracts of Christic, Brothers, and S. B. Kelly. At Newville, 6000 acres of the Newville Lumber Co. 2000 acres of the Fox River Lumber Co. At Sand River, 7000 acres of E. I. White & Son; and at Shulee a large area. Large gangs of men were engaged for weeks in endeavoring to check the fires, and in many cases they met with considerable success.

From New Brunswick it is reported that the lumber market is about station. ary. Ocean deal freights are still very low, 35 shillings being the rate hence to west coast of England. Several steamers have left St. John and a number of others about ready to proceed with full cargoes. The Gibson Company have shipped ten schooner loads to the American market and large lots by rail, besides some immense deal shipments to the old country.

It is said that about 35,000,000 feet of logs are still "liung up" above Grand Falls on the St. John river, as the rains have not been heavy enough to bring them out. In St. John county the loss to standing timber by forest fires has been heavy. At one place a thousand acres were burned over, and while the timber that is large enough can be cut and manufactured, the young growth is ruined for years to come.
