The governments of it, though various, have been balanced by each other : and the people in general have been happy even under the most delpotic forms it contains, becaufe the views and conduct of princes have been moderated by their mutual jealoufies. Was it for us, who had exclaimed fo loudly against universal monarchy, and had laid out fo much blood and treasure to oppose those ambitious powers, who, at different periods, were supposed to have conceived the idea, was it for us to extend our dominious from pole to pole, and to all the thores that are walked by the Indian are Atlantic oceans? Was it wile in a free flate to raife fuch a jealoufy in other flates, as would produce a combination against us, which might one day prove our ruin, whether we conquer or are conquered ? For, in the first cafe, we should certainly perish by our own corruption, as, in the fecond, by the power of the enemy.

To this caule is probably owing that weakness of government, which has been of late fo much felt and complained of, and which no capacity feems hitherto able to repair.
